TOGETHER THIS IS WHAT WE HAVE BUILT

As we say goodbye to 2019 and move forward into a new year and decade, our County and State continue to be challenged by major societal issues. 27% of youth in Stanislaus County are struggling with mental health issues, families are struggling to meet their basic needs, the homeless population continues to grow, and 23 % of Stanislaus County families are food insecure. When these challenges are faced by our families it contributes to mental health issues, crime, child abuse, drug use, and domestic violence.

Sierra Vista Child & Family Services has strategically positioned itself to meet the needs of the children and families in our communities by developing a full continuum of care. Through our diversified and much needed services, our trained and experienced staff are serving over 18,000 children, adults and families each year throughout Stanislaus and Merced Counties. Combined with our collaborative relationships with the county departments of Behavioral Health and Recovery Services, Community Services Agency, Probation, Public Health, The Legacy Health Endowment and the Emanuel Medical Center Foundation, and other local Grants, we are changing lives and giving children hope.

Sierra Vista began as Therapeutic Homes Inc. in 1972 with one Group Home, and at the request of our County Departments soon began to develop additional services to meet the needs of children and families. Each year since the inception of this agency, through the leadership of our caring and dedicated staff of professionals and paraprofessionals, we have continued to respond to our County's requests for new services.

Sierra Vista has been successful in building effective evidence-based services and managing continual growth due to the support of so many people and businesses in the community. We have accomplished all of this because of you, our staff, our donors and our partners.

I am proud to have led this Agency for 35 years. I have worked with some of the most caring and capable County Leaders anyone could have hoped for. Sierra Vista's Administrative Team, Leadership Team and Staff are individuals with incredible skill sets, training in evidenced-based practices and some of the most dedicated people you will ever meet.

All of this makes it bittersweet to announce that I retired, effective February 28, 2020. Darrell Paulk has stepped into the CEO seat at Sierra Vista. Darrell comes with many years of experience running large non-profit agencies like Sierra Vista and successful experience as an Interim CEO for many agencies. I will continue to support and advocate for Sierra Vista and the initiatives and programs working to strengthen families and communities. Together, we will continue to make a difference.

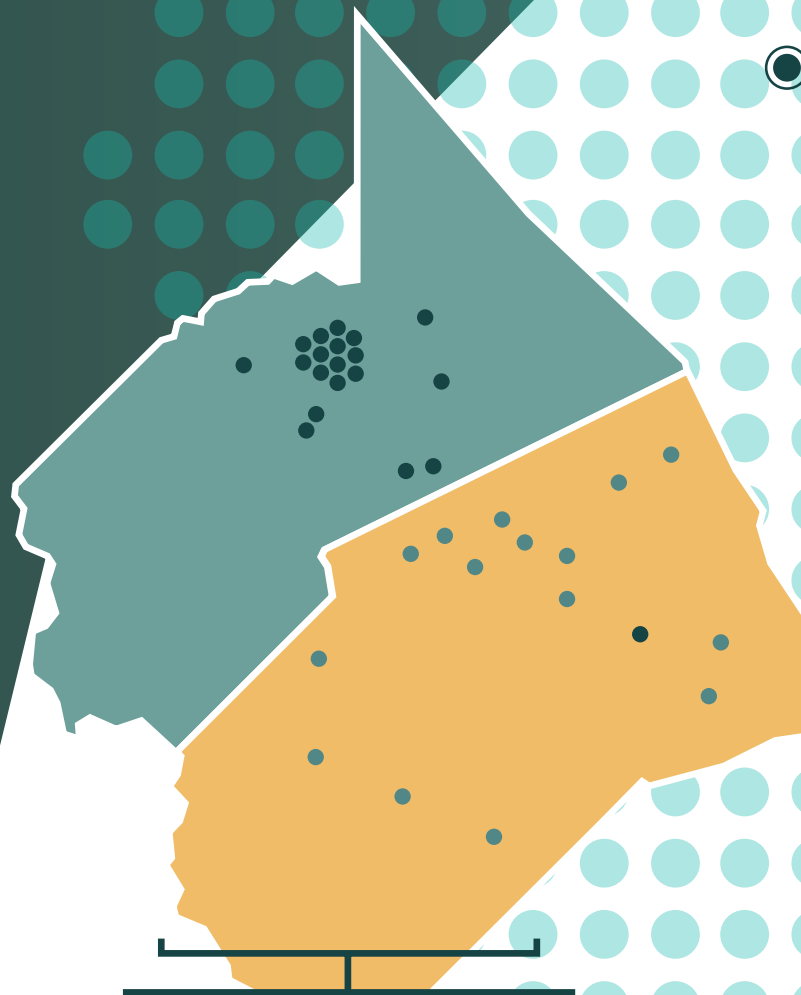

Children & Family Counseling Services

3,484 Children and Families Served

Services are provided for children and families experiencing emotional difficulties. Services include assessment and evaluation; individual, group and family counseling; school consultation and advocacy; parent education groups; children's social skills groups and medication services as needed.

Foster Care, Adoption, Short-Term Residential Therapy

90 Children In Our Care

This program serves children in all 58 counties throughout the state of California. The services range from intensive treatment services, foster care, to traditional case management. This program operates from the ideals that every child deserves a safe and nurturing environment so they have the chance to succeed in life.

Non-Public Schools & Public School-Based Services

367 Children Served

Our Non-Public Schools (Kirk Baucher and Turlock Learning Center) provide special education for children in kindergarten through eighth grade. Public School-Based Services provide on-site counseling services and assessment for students who are referred by school staff or are diagnosed as behaviorally challenged.

Family Resource Centers

6,911 Children and Families Served

Our community-based family resource centers focus on improving the well-being of children, youth, families, and communities. Our goal is to ensure that the children and families in our area are provided the necessary access to programs and services by providing outreach and support services.

Adult & Community Services

2,731 Adults Served

This program provides critically needed counseling services to individuals and families. The goal is to improve family relationships and reduce family violence and the occurrence of child abuse and neglect by offering low-cost individual, family, and marital therapy, making them attainable for many families in crisis.



Regional Mentoring Alliance

80 Mentors Serving 70 Mentees

The goal is to build a positive relationship that focuses on supporting the social and academic development of a child. We bring together mentors, mentees, educators, businesses, community leaders and community-based organizations; and empower them with the knowledge, skills, and training necessary.



First Step Perinatal Substance Abuse Treatment

161 Women and 147 Children Served

This program is a drug and alcohol treatment program for pregnant, postpartum and parenting women and their children ages 0-5. The goal of the program is to assist and support women in developing positive parenting skills while learning to live a healthy, drug and alcohol-free lifestyle.



Sierra Vista Merced

2,291 Children Served

This program provides a continuum of services for children and families that are accepted from daycares, preschools, Head Start programs, county & community-based agencies, and other service providers. Parent education and support are provided in various locations including the family's home, school, or daycare site.

REGIONAL MENTORING ALLIANCE



Our Sierra Vista school-based mentoring program first launched back in the fall of 2015 with five mentors at Burbank Elementary School (Modesto City Schools). Since then, we have expanded to 4 more schools within

Modesto City Schools:

Kirschen Elementary, Mark Twain Jr. High, Wilson Elementary, and Orville Wright Elementary. We have also added our newest expansion within the Denair Unified School District. Our volunteer mentors meet with their student (mentee) for one hour per week at the student's school. The goal is to build a positive relationship that focuses on supporting the social and academic development of the student and enhance the student's overall school experience. Having a mentor significantly increases a student's potential for success. Children and youth who have mentors experience improved self-esteem, higher academic achievement, increased motivation in school, and greater quality lifestyle choices.

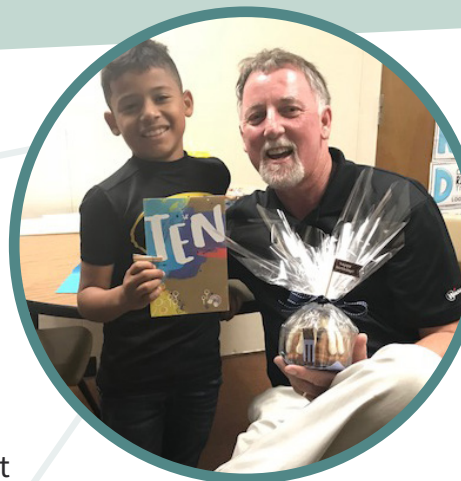


As we have seen the positive impact that mentoring has had on our students, the need for mentors has also increased tremendously. At our five sites within Modesto City Schools and Denair Elementary

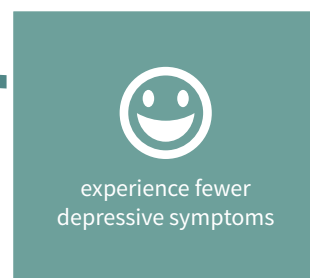

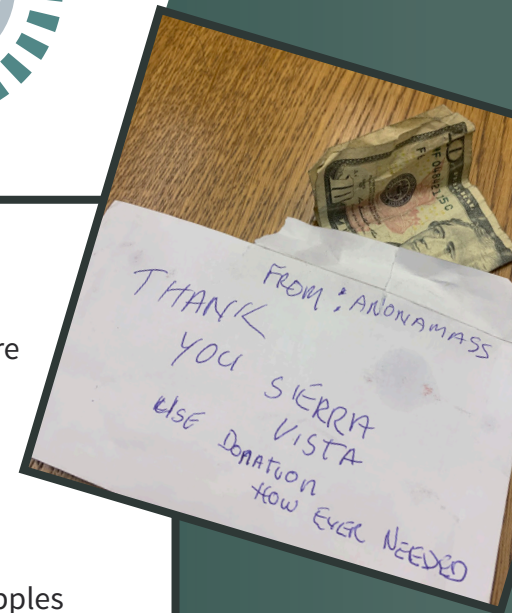


COMMUNITY IMPACT
