By offering quality programs that meet the growing needs of the literally thousands of people of all ages, who were overwhelmed with mental illness, child abuse or substance abuse, children and families have found healing and hope at Sierra Vista.

Sierra Vista Child & Family Services has been helping abused, neglected, and emotionally disturbed children and families in crisis in California's Central Valley since 1972. The agency was the vision of H.I. Tom Sawyer, a dairy farmer and a volunteer member of the Stanislaus County Mental Health Advisory Board. The agency's foundation was built on the belief that children need positive and loving role models to grow into healthy adults.

Over the past four decades, Sierra Vista has grown into one of the

largest nonprofit agencies in the region, serving more than 20,000 children and families each year with over 270 dedicated employees, 27 programs, and providing services throughout Stanislaus and Merced County. The integration of these programs into the community has created a sustainable continuum of child and family services that are accessible and tailored to addressing a broad range of needs. This commitment to the community has established Sierra Vista Child & Family Services as a leader in best practices in the fields of mental health and family support services.

Sierra Vista Child & Family Services has demonstrated the stability, reliability, and commitment necessary to tackle the tough problems that have come with each new era by remaining on the cutting edge of service delivery. Client Success Story

Sierra Vista Child & Family Services meets the needs of children and families with mental health services and resources to strengthen their lives and the lives around them.

Sierra Vista Child and Family Services provides educational services and supports to children and families within the county and in neighboring communities. Our educational services include public school-based counseling programs as well as several non-public school campuses. Students are identified and assessed by school districts and qualify for special education services. Based on the student's Individual Educational Plan and level of need, the school district refers students to Sierra Vista for educational and counseling services. The non-public school program provides the highest level of care with the most resources and supports offered to students and families. Our students have not been successful in a less restrictive educational setting and benefit from the intensive individual, group, and family counseling as well as academic support. Sierra Vista strives to improve the lives of students and their families by promoting emotional, social, and behavioral stability. Growth and development are a focus for students within the educational setting in addition to the overall well-being of the family. The non-public school setting offers many resources and partners with many systems of care. This

empowers students and families to access services and resources that are focused on their unique needs.

Recently, Sierra Vista's non-public school program was working very closely with a family that has been really struggling in many areas. The family had been homeless for several months. It is a single parent home with multiple children who require intensive mental health support and special education services. Several of the children are students at our non-public school. The parent also struggles with mental health concerns and required a lot of mentoring and guidance. Due to being homeless, the family was moving frequently. Sierra Vista was able to assist with transporting the children to school so they would have access to their education and services. Sierra Vista was also able to support the family by providing food, clothing, and housing/care for the family pets so they would not lose them. The family was also connected with additional resources in the community to help them with day to day needs. This support through the school and the community assisted the family in stabilizing and finding housing.



Our Programs & Services

Sierra Vista is the largest, most comprehensive private nonprofit 501(c)(3) community mental health based agency in the central valley.



Children & Family Counseling Services

4,981 Children and Families Served

Counseling services can reduce stress and conflict, improve parenting skills and strengthen family ties.

Services are provided for children and families experiencing emotional difficulties. Services include assessment and evaluation; individual, group and family counseling; school consultation and advocacy; parent education groups; children's social skills groups and medication services as needed.



Adult & Community Services

2,025 Clients Served

This program provides critically needed counseling services to individuals/families. We offer low-cost individual, family, and marital therapy, making them attainable for many families in need and in crisis, who would otherwise not be able to afford such services. The goals of this program are; improving family relationships, reducing family violence and the occurrence of child abuse and neglect in our community.

Family Resource Centers

10,077 Children and Families Served

Sierra Vista's community-based family resource centers focus on improving the well-being of children, youth, families, and communities. Our goals are to ensure that the children and families in our area are provided the necessary access to programs and services by providing outreach and support services.

Sierra Vista's family resource centers include Sierra Vista Drop-In Center, serving areas in the south and west Modesto, North Modesto Family Resource Center, Hughson Family Resource Center, which serves Hughson and other southeast Stanislaus County communities and The Bridge, which provides services to the Southeast Asian refugee community and their families.



Non-Public Schools & Public School Based Services

273 Children Served

Sierra Vista has two non-public schools (Kirk Baucher and Turlock Learning Center) that provide special education for children in kindergarten through eighth grade. This specialized setting offers individualized education services, social skills development, behavior management, crisis intervention, and family support.

Our Public School Based Services provide on-site counseling services and assessment for students who are referred by school staff or are diagnosed as emotionally disturbed.



First Step Perinatal Substance Abuse Treatment Program

197 Women and 161 Children Served

First Step is a drug and alcohol treatment program for pregnant, postpartum and parenting women and their children. The goal of the program is to assist and support women in developing positive parenting skills while learning to live a healthy, drug- and alcohol-free lifestyle.

First Step's child development center also helps children ages 0-5 meet their developmental milestones and learn social skills that assist with school readiness.



Foster Care, Adoption, Residential Treatment & Intensive Treatment Services

93 Children Served

Sierra Vista Child & Family Services Foster Care & Adoption Program serves children in all 58 counties throughout the state of California. The services range from intensive treatment services, regular foster care, to traditional case management. This program operates from the ideals that every child deserves a safe and nurturing environment so they have the chance to succeed in life. The goal is to give these children that opportunity by providing stable and loving homes.

Our Programs & Services



Sierra Vista Merced
2,329 Children Served

Sierra Vista Merced provides a continuum of services for children and families. Referral based services are accepted from daycares, preschools, Head Start programs, county and community-based agencies, and other services providers. Children receive direct mental health services when necessary, including individual and group services. Parent education and support are provided individually, in groups, and in various locations including the family's home, school, or day care site.

Sierra Vista utilizes evidence-based and best practice curriculums determined by a families needs. Our model includes working with parents and children together in social skills and relationship enhancing activities.

Mentoring Matters!

Make a difference in a child's life.
One mentor: One child: One hour a week

As the newest program to Sierra Vista Child & Family Services, the Regional Mentoring Alliance in partnership with Modesto City Schools and Patterson Unified School District are working together to provide a quality mentoring program that follows "best practices" at local school sites that will match students with trained, compatible adult mentors. Mentors meet with their students for one hour per week at the student's school campus. The commitment is a minimum of one academic year. The program includes trained staff to supervise, as well as, offer activities and a safe place for both mentors and mentees to meet. The goal is to

build a positive relationship that focuses on supporting the social and academic development of the student and enhance the student's overall school experience.

Mentoring programs might be one of the most valuable programs for communities to readily support themselves. By simply making connections, youth can find outlets for personal growth and schoolwork support, parents can find a supporter to assist in their child's development, teachers can have their work reinforced, and mentors can grow from engaging with their mentee(s). Studies show that mentoring is one of the most powerful forces in education.

Students who meet regularly with their mentors are 52% less likely than their peers to skip a day of school and 37% less likely to skip a class.

The Regional Mentoring Alliance is the rallying point for mentoring within the region based upon the elements of "best practices" for mentoring programs. It is the catalyst in linking individuals, organizations, and communities to existing mentoring programs, and help to extend the reach of high-quality mentoring programs and leverage additional services in local communities for sustainability and success.



Regional Mentoring Alliance

The Sierra Vista Child & Family Services Regional Mentoring Alliance brings together mentors, mentees, educators, businesses, community leaders and community-based organizations, and empowers them with the knowledge, skills, and training necessary to create a culture of mentoring in our community through becoming mentors, advocates, and supporters of our youth.

The Regional Mentoring Alliance provides individuals and programs that are interested in mentoring or want to be mentors, such as parents/guardians, coaches, staff, business and community leaders, with the appropriate training needed to be an effective and empowered mentor, so they have the greatest positive impact possible!

The impact mentoring has on the mentor and mentee, organizations and communities provide a significant difference to all that are involved. Our goal is to extend the reach of high-quality mentoring programs in our local community for sustainability and success. Through our Regional Mentoring Alliance, we will provide communities and schools the tools to develop positive relationships that have a direct and lasting effect on the lives of the children and families served.

“Mentored youth show increased levels of self-esteem and self-worth, reduced absences from school,

improvement academically and in school interaction, develop greater respect and interaction with peers and adults, learn about the opportunities available to them, discover that the choices they make have consequences that impact them through their lives, and show a greater understanding of the opportunities available to them and the positive impact they can have on their community,” said Judy Kindle, Executive Director of Sierra Vista Child & Family Services.

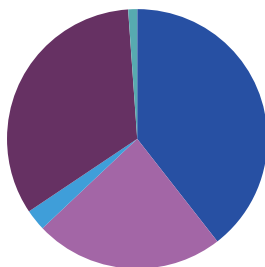

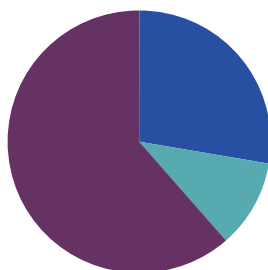
Financials

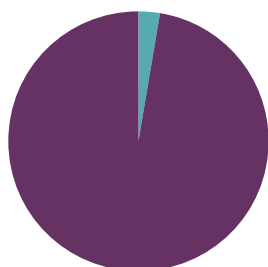
